

For those coming from Ukraine

If you are from Ukraine and have travelled into Sweden you may have the right to stay in the country according to the following.

Stay up to 90 days without a permit

If you have a biometric passport you can stay in Sweden for up to 90 days without a permit. You must be able to support yourself in the meantime and have somewhere to live.

Applying for a permit under the Temporary Protection Directive

The EU has decided to activate the Temporary Protection Directive. This means that if you are from Ukraine you can get a temporary residence permit within the EU. The permit gives you the possibility to receive help in Sweden with housing, the right to work, the right to seek health care, schooling for the children, and daily allowance.

The directive applies to Ukrainian citizens, permanent residents of Ukraine or those who has protection status in Ukraine. To be covered by the directive, you must have left Ukraine after 24 February 2022.

Applying for asylum

If you need protection you can apply for asylum. The Swedish Migration Agency can help you with housing and financial support while you wait for a decision. You can also choose to arrange accommodation on your own.
